Each guide dog costs the charity around £56000 and 99% of funding is from community donations.















### Earth Day





Parkgate House celebrated Earth Day by becoming immersed in nature and celebrating the natural environment around us in all its full glory. Each year group visited Clapham Common to take part in an active session with the Friends of Clapham Common charity, who work to increase biodiversity in our local area. The children were taught how to mulch the new trees that have been planted and they saw the young tadpoles in the pond. During the day, the Eco Reps delivered seeds and pots for each class to grow their own class plant! They also helped their classmates to litter-pick on the Common, as well as installing a new bird feeder in the playground.

This is a national competition which helps to show the importance of problem solving and allows pupils to try a variety of methods. The children enjoyed the challenge this year and we had some excellent results! A particular "well done" to the following children who received a certificate: Hugo (P4), Charlie (P3), Louisa (P3), Olivia (P4), Zoe (P4) and Zac (P4). Hugo commented: "It was pretty challenging, but if you really put your all into it, you could get it done. I love maths so I enjoyed the challenge!". Bea said: "It expanded my knowledge in a helpful way; for example, thinking on the spot under pressure, and applying the mathematical strategies we have been taught in class". The challenge is great preparation for the Primary Maths Challenge, which the children will sit in Prep 5 and Prep 6.

Four children in Prep 5 enjoyed an exciting day competing in a Maths Challenge hosted by Emanuel School. The children enjoyed a host of tricky problems, team games and timed puzzles! Amelia, Fergus, Margot and Edie represented Parkgate wonderfully and they thoroughly enjoyed the challenge! Fergus said: "I found it difficult but really fun". Margot commented: "I enjoyed meeting children from other schools. The challenges were hard, but I felt good doing them!". Very well done!

The children were delighted to share their artwork with their families. They were inspired by artist Cecilia Vicuña and her recent Brain Forest Quipu installation at Tate Modern. The children based their artwork on key deforestation messages and created large collages using recycled materials collected throughout the term. They also participated in a workshop to create the 'Brain Forest' and came up with inventive ways to join and hang the fabric. In collaboration with the Music Department, the children created a rainforest soundscape to complement the artwork on display. It was lovely to receive these comments from one of our parents: "It was honestly mind-blowing... The musical background also worked really well and gave the whole room the impression of a professional art gallery. Big thumbs up and the children absolutely loved it!". To support our local community, the auction proceeds were donated to local charity 'Friends of Clapham Common' which runs conservation projects to improve the biodiversity of the Common and to restore its buildings and facilities. Furthermore, we are delighted to share the success of our students in the ABRSM exams held this term. Each student performed exceptionally well, and over 80% of our students achieved Merit and Distinctions; a remarkable achievement that highlights their dedication and musical prowess.








### HORNIMAN MUSEUM TRIP














### **ACTIVITY WEEK**
